iSingPOP is a primary school singing and recording project that brings together school, church and community by using the entire school to produce its very own pop album. Typically, it takes four days to learn and record the songs, then a week later the children perform them at a concert held at the local church. This is a fantastic opportunity to celebrate the achievements of the children through a wonderful live performance. There is also an opportunity to purchase a copy of the album.

# Church Partnership•

Typically, each party would share the funding of the project with the church providing the venue for the concert. ## What's included?



The iSingPOP experience will include:

- 3 days of teaching where pupils learn a set of high energy, fun-filled, current sounding pop songs - each one based around a Christian value.
- A recording session with a sound engineer and mobile recording system.
- Up to two concerts involving every member of the school, ie Foundation
- Professional live production including PA, visuals and all equipment
- The chance for families and the local community to see the children perform at their concert, usually in a local church.
- → A set of songs (with lyric videos) that can be used as resource for
- → A complimentary copy of the album for the school and also for the church.
- Partnership with your local church.

#### **Teaching days**

Below is an example timetable, however we are always open to some flexibility in order to accommodate your particular needs. Please consult with your iSingPOP project leader.

#### **Teaching - Days 1 to 3**

9.10am - 10.40am Years 5+6

#### **Recording - Day 4**

On day four of the project an iSingPOP sound engineer, will arrive with mobile recording equipment and work with the project leader to record the children's vocals. This will then be mixed and mastered back at the studio to create your own school album.

#### **Concert - Day 5**

#### A typical timetable is as follows:

10.00am – Sound Engineer arrives at Church to set-up

1.00pm - Children arrive for sound check

2.00pm - Doors open

2.15pm - Concert 1 starts (45 mins)

6.00pm - Doors open for concert 2

6.15pm - Concert 2 starts (45 mins)
